

GALT IRRIGATION DISTRICT
Regular Board Meeting Minutes
April 14, 2026

Opening:

1. The meeting was called to order by Chairman VanWarmerdam at 6:04 p.m. at the Galt Irrigation District office, Herald, California.
2. Members present were Leo VanWarmerdam, John Mulrooney, Pat Kirby, Tony Merola and Cameron Crouch. Also present were Mike Wackman, Lindsey Carter, Teresa Flewellyn and Wendy Sparrowk.
3. Public Comment – Nothing to report.

Consent Items:

1. The minutes for the March 10, 2026 Regular Board meeting were reviewed. The Board reviewed the current bills and Treasurer's Report. Motion was made by Director Mulrooney to approve the Minutes, Treasurer's Report and monthly bills; motion second by Director Crouch. The bills were as follows:

Information/Action Items:

1. Administrator's Report – GID has not received further correspondence from attorney for Robert Hoze. EBMUD has an annual BBQ at Pardee on May 15. The need for a Procurement Policy was discussed.
2. Safety Report – Nothing to report.
3. Groundwater Management Report –
 - a. CGA update – Lindsey Carter- The April CGA meeting was cancelled. City of Galt status was reviewed. The SWAG (Stakeholder Water Advisement Group) will have an outreach presentation in May/June. EKI is working on a sustainable management report due in May. The annual report was submitted with updated GW data reports included. The spring well monitoring will take place this week. One well monitored will be a representative well (reported to DWR) at VanVlecks ranch. The other 4 wells are supplemental. CGA is currently undergoing a 2024/25 audit.
 - b. DWR Stream Gage grant update –The 7th site on Jackson Creek was approved by DWR and Amador County Board of Supervisors. There is continued tribal interest but moving forward with Wild Eye and gage installments.
 - c. Wild Eye Pilot Program- proposal – Sergio, Wild Eye, has been working with Lindsey on a pilot project to help show consistent water levels on a regular basis rather than just 2 times a year for 3 wells in data gap areas. It was reported that SHRCDC has a Wild Eye monitor at Deniers (across from fish farm) that has shown consistent levels without fluctuations. Lindsey will communicate with Sergio to answer Director questions pertaining to lifespan of equipment, cost per year to access data and subscription fees.
 - d. Wackman Consulting Report- Mike Wackman discussed complaints from local residents about the quality of the discharge water from The Fishery. Chairman VanWarmerdam will

contact owner and request water sampling and meeting with Directors. Other wells being tested for quality were discussed.

4. Other Business-

a. Walker Estates – Nothing to report.

b. November 3, 2026 election – A resolution and supporting documents for the November 3, 2026 election were read and reviewed. Directors VanWarmerdam, Kirby, Merola and Crouch are slated for re-election. Motion was made by Director Crouch to approve the resolution and supporting documents; motion second by Director Mulrooney.
